ORDER

Compliance of order/direction dated 22.09.2017 of the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal as passed in OA No. 3375/2017 titled as Ms. Mamta V/s GNCTD.

The Hon'ble CAT in OA No. 3375/2017, titled as Ms. Mamta V/s GNCTD vide its order dated 22.09.2017 has directed as under:-

"In view of the above, this application is disposed of at the admission stage itself with a direction to respondent no. 2 to take decision on the representations of the applicant by passing a reasoned and speaking order within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order."

In compliance of above order dated 22.09.2017, the candidature (Roll No. 07084854) of Ms. Mamta was thoroughly examined in DSSSB. As per requisition received from the User department (MCD), The DSSSB advertised 4500 (UR-1900, OBC-1044, SC-766, ST-790) including PH (OH-OA/OL/OAL/BL)-52, PH (VH-B/LV)-96, EXSM-982 vacancies for the post of Teacher (Primary) under Post Code 70/09 vide advertisement No. 04/2009. The cut off date in the Post Code 70/09 was 15.01.2010. Later, the vacancies were increased from 4500 to 6500 vide addendum of Advertisement Number 04/2009, total 6500 (UR-2910, OBC-1584, SC-1066, ST-940) including PH/OH-52, PH/VH-122 & EXSM-982. Further after conversion of the post from Group C to Group B by the User department i.e. MCD, amendment were made in the advertisement No. 04/2009 alongwith it's addendum and finally the number of vacancies were advertised as total 6500 (UR-2886, OBC-1610, SC-939 & ST-1065 including PH/OH-99 and PH/VH-152).

The petitioner Ms. Mamta having Roll No. 07084854 appeared in written examination for the post of Teacher (Primary) under post code 70/09 which was conducted on 02.02.2014. As per policy of DSSSB the Minimum qualifying marks for OBC category candidate is 35% and as such in the present case the minimum qualifying marks were 69.25 out of 198 marks i.e. 35%. As per

record, Ms. Mamta (Roll No. 07084854) secured 67.75 marks out of 198 marks under OBC category in written examination whereas the minimum qualifying marks are 69.25 and the last selected candidates under OBC category secured 69.25 marks, hence the applicant, petitioner Ms. Mamta could not be selected for the post of Teacher Primary under post code 70/09 as she had secured less than minimum qualifying marks i.e. 35% in the written examination required as per policy for OBC category.

In view of the above facts, the claim and candidature for selection to the post of Primary Teacher under post code 70/09 in respect of the petitioner Ms. Mamta has been considered & examined and not found admissible in view of the facts mentioned above, hence rejected.

This issues with prior approval of the Competent Authority.
